- To give you extra knowledge to use in your existing work whether working in a gym setting or taking group exercise classes
- To enable you to offer exercise programmes either on an individual basis or for a group to clients who have heart disease

The BACPR Exercise Instructor Training Programme (funded by the British Heart Foundation) was launched in 1997 to provide specialist training for exercise professionals who wanted to prescribe and deliver exercise programmes as part of the overall long-term management of individuals with heart disease. There are now over 2000 qualified instructors spread across the UK and this course is recognised by the Register of Exercise Professionals and Skills Active.

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Entry Criteria

EXERCISE QUALIFICATION

Applicants must enclose with their application a copy of the certificate issued by the awarding body whose training is recognised as equivalent to a NVQ level 3 in Exercise and Fitness and preferably hold an exercise referral qualification. If a candidate is in any doubt about whether their training matches these standards they should visit the Register of Exercise Professionals website www.exerciseregister.org or www.repsireland.ie

A relevant degree combined with evidence of extensive instructor experience will also be considered. In this case you will be required to produce evidence of the syllabus/modules relating to the theory and application of cardiovascular anatomy and physiology along with details of the assessment process.

EXPERIENCE

Minimum of 150 hours of teaching adults land based cardiovascular exercise gained within the previous 2 years and at least 6 months experience since qualification

PHASE III ENDORSEMENT

Exercise instructors wishing to undertake Phase IV training will be asked to have their application endorsed by their local Phase III cardiac rehabilitation team. If accepted on the course they will be expected to visit at least 4 sessions and, on completion of the course, will be asked to submit one written case study as part of their formal assessment. Successful completion of the case study will depend, in part, on the co-operation of Phase III rehabilitation staff. The BACPR acknowledges that the support and expertise of Phase III professionals will play an invaluable part in the Phase IV instructors' initial learning experience and hope that good collaboration between professionals will be to their mutual benefit and of significant long term advantage to CHD patients.
